

Caring for Alzheimers & Memory Care

This course, developed by Teepa Snow, offers an in-depth exploration of Typical and Atypical Aging, Positive Physical Approach™ (PPA™), Hand Under Hand® (HUH®), and Teepa's GEMS® States. Throughout the course, students will learn practical skills and strategies to build meaningful connections with individuals living with Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia.

Learners will examine the differences between "normal" and "not normal" aging. The focus is on understanding how to tailor care to meet the needs and retained abilities of individuals with dementia, promoting a sense of control and independence.

The course also introduces Positive Approach to Care's techniques, including PPA and HUH. These methods teach care partners how to interact more effectively, shifting from simply managing behaviors to fostering deeper connections. Participants will practice techniques that emphasize doing tasks with individuals, rather than for them, to create a more positive and supportive care environment.

The course delves into Teepa Snow's GEMS® States, a model comparing cognitive abilities to precious gems, which helps care partners better understand and respond to changes in behavior and abilities. This course emphasizes the importance of adjusting care, communication, and expectations as dementia progresses, ensuring that care is responsive and compassionate. Certified Nurse Assistant

The Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) Training Program is designed to equip aspiring healthcare professionals with the essential skills and knowledge needed to provide compassionate and competent care to patients in various healthcare settings. Taught by experienced and knowledgeable instructors, this comprehensive course combines Webex remote classroom instruction, in-person laboratory practice, and clinical experience at a long-term care facility.



CNAs are vital healthcare team members, performing hands-on care for patients, residents, and clients of all ages and abilities. Students are prepared for the Massachusetts Nurse Aide Competency Exam in just eight weeks.

Graduates of CNA Training Programs can find employment working with patients of all ages in hospitals, rehabilitation centers, clinics, nursing homes, home health, assisted living facilities, schools, medical offices, and as travel CNAs.

This certification is a foundation for further education and advancement in other health professional careers.

In this 120-hour certificate program, students will

- · Understand the role and responsibilities of a CNA
- Gain proficiency in basic nursing skills such as patient hygiene, mobility assistance, and vital signs
- Understand the principles of infection control and safety procedures
- · Ensure comfort and dignity while assisting with activities of daily living
- Gain effective communication techniques to work with patients, families, and other healthcare personnel
- Be well prepared to sit for the state certification exam and meet the requirements for employment as a CNA

Home Health Aide Training

Course Overview: Mass Bay's Home Health Aide (HHA) Training Program is designed to further the skills of Certified Nurse Assistants (CNAs) by preparing them to deliver exceptional in-home care. This bridge program builds on the core competencies gained in the CNA training, providing students with the specialized knowledge needed to assist clients with daily living tasks, promote independence, and improve overall quality of life in a home setting.

Course Objectives:

- Master advanced caregiving techniques, including personal care, nutrition, and household management.
- Develop effective communication strategies for working with clients, their families, and healthcare providers.
- Learn safety and emergency protocols to ensure a secure home environment.
- Build upon the skills and knowledge gained from your CNA program.
- Understand infection control measures and health monitoring specific to home care.

Certification: Upon successfully completing the program, students will meet the certification requirements for Home Health Aides in Massachusetts. This certification enables graduates to provide care in home settings under the supervision of licensed healthcare professionals.

Prerequisites:

- Successful completion of a Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) course
- · High school diploma or equivalent
- · Basic English proficiency (reading, writing, and speaking)
- Physical ability to perform Home Health Aide duties

Medical Interpreter Program

Medical Interpreter Program: Open to all languages, this 60-hour program provides working knowledge of medical interpreting, including standards of practice, ethics, HIPAA regulations, cultural competency, and medical terminology/vocabulary. This course is designed for those preparing for entry-level careers as medical interpreters as well as for working interpreters preparing for the National Board Certificate exam. Students must be fully bilingual and must be fluent in English and one other language.



This program meets the National Board for Medical Interpreter Certification and/or Commission of Health Care Interpreter's training requirement and prepares you to pass the national certification exam. Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive a certificate of completion from the college and may elect to apply for national certification. Certification fees are not included. Students must possess a high school diploma or equivalent. Because a language assessment is required, students must register at least two weeks in advance.

Basic Life Support Provider (BLS): This course is for healthcare professionals who need to know how to perform CPR, as well as other lifesaving skills, in a wide variety of in-hospital and out-of-hospital settings.

This course is intended for both initial and renewal BLS training. This course covers the following topics:

The Behavioral Health Apprenticeship Certificate is the first year of the Associate's degree in Behavioral Health. It allows students to work in the field while earning credits towards their degree. It is designed to equip participants with the essential skills and knowledge needed to excel in the field of behavioral health. Combining classroom instruction with hands-on experience, this program prepares individuals for a rewarding career in supporting mental health and wellness. Key components include:

- Foundational Knowledge: Participants will learn the principles of behavioral health, including mental health disorders, treatment modalities, and the role of technology in enhancing care.
- Technical Skills Training: Instruction on the use of behavioral health technologies, such as electronic health records (EHR), telehealth platforms, and mobile health applications, ensuring proficiency in modern tools used in the field.

FAQs

1. What is an apprenticeship program?

An apprenticeship program combines on-the-job training with classroom instruction, allowing participants to gain practical experience while learning the theoretical aspects of their chosen field and earning college credits for learning. It prepares individuals for skilled professions through mentorship and hands-on learning.

2. Who is eligible to apply for the apprenticeship program?

Eligibility criteria may vary by program but generally include being at least 18 years old, possessing a high school diploma or equivalent, and demonstrating a genuine interest in the field. Specific programs may have additional requirements.

3. How long does the apprenticeship program last?

The duration of the program typically ranges from 8 months to 2 years, depending on the field of study and the specific training requirements.

4. What kind of training will participants receive?

Participants will receive a combination of classroom instruction and hands-on training in a real-world setting. This includes skill development, safety practices, and mentorship from experienced professionals.
